MEDICO-LEGAL EXPERIENCE

Dr Pipon-Young has experience of conducting assessments and written reports of adults for a wide range of medico-legal contexts including the family courts and personal injury cases. She provides opinions for people with a wide range of difficulties including mental health issues, personality problems, trauma/ PTSD and autism spectrum disorders. She has specialist interests in attachment, trauma and complex trauma as well as non-accidental injury in children.

These difficulties include complex psychiatric presentations (such as psychosis) to more subtle issues relating to **problematic personality traits** and **higher functioning autism spectrum disorders**. She has an interest in cases where non-accidental injury towards children is suspected and has conducted numerous **risk assessments of parents**.

MEDICO-LEGAL SPECIALIST TRAINING

Dr Pipon-Young has undertaken specialist training in the assessment of attachment, personality, ADHD, PTSD, intellectual functioning and cognitive assessments. She is also familiar with assessing individuals where impression management may be a feature.

Dr Pipon-Young has provided **oral evidence in court** many times, including the High Court, in her capacity as an expert witness and has undertaken specific training in court skills.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

Dr Pipon-Young has worked within mental health services since 2002. She currently works in independent practice, primarily as an expert witness and clinical assessor in ADHD and autism. She has provided over 500 reports for the civil, criminal and family courts since 2014, as well as Immigration Tribunals, the Court of Protection and in housing cases.

Outside of expert witness work, Dr Pipon-Young has been involved with the Horizon Scandal Support Fund providing therapy to victims of the Post Office scandal.

Previous positions include Principal Clinical Psychologist for a specialist family intervention service in East Sussex, where Dr Pipon-Young assessed and offered interventions to parents involved with Local Authority Children's Services. She also managed the cognitive assessment service for East Sussex County Council and was responsible for over 100 cognitive assessment reports during her time in this position.





CLINICAL EXPERIENCE CONTD.

Prior to this, Dr Pipon-Young was the lead clinical psychologist for an NHS women's forensic inpatient service covering West and East Sussex localities. She has 8 years of experience working with adult forensic populations in medium and low secure hospital settings, as well as in community rehabilitation.

Dr Pipon-Young has undertaken specialist training in the assessment of personality, parental attachment strategies, domestic abuse, psychopathy, ADHD, autism and intellectual functioning. She is known as having particular expertise in the expressions of neurodiversity in women (e.g., ADHD and autism).

Dr Pipon-Young is also trained in the Meaning of the Child Interview, which looks at a parent's understanding of their relationship with their child. Dr Pipon-Young has specialisms in complex trauma, attachment, and non-accidental injury of children. She regularly completes risk assessments of adults including cases of sexual harm, child abuse, infanticide, violence, and fabricated and induced illness (FII).

In addition to her clinical and expert witness roles, Dr Pipon-Young was previously a visiting lecturer at the University of Sussex in the areas of clinical and forensic psychology between 2013—2018 and an associate member of Canterbury Christ Church University in her capacity as a research supervisor for the clinical psychology doctorate course. She has also presented at national and local conferences on issues relating to forensic psychology, parenting and women's mental health. Dr Pipon-Young now mentors and supervises other forensic and clinical psychologists who are acting as expert witnesses. Since 2023, Dr Pipon-Young has also delivered a series of webinars and presentations to legal professionals in areas of relevance to expert witness work.

DR PIPON-YOUNG'S SKILLS CAN BE SUMMARISED AS FOLLOWS:

- Full psychological assessment of individuals with a specialism in personality, trauma, cognitive issues, non-accidental injury, risk, impression management and relationship functioning.
- Risk assessments around parenting, self-harm/ suicidality, domestic violence, sexual offending (including against children), substance misuse, arson and many forms of recidivism risk.
- Assessment & treatment of people with mental health histories, psychopathy, personality disorders, eating distress, attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder, autistic spectrum disorders, drug & alcohol problems and histories of trauma.
- Assessment of mental capacity and functioning (particularly in relation to fitness to litigate/ plead/ stand trial).
- Leadership and supervision of others.
- Training and consultation to wide range of audiences including legal professionals, social work staff, students and other psychology colleagues.
- Conducting research and service development projects in the areas of forensic mental health, including development of novel treatment protocols and service policies.
